River. This Southern Plantation details the life of the “Father of Our Country and provided insights into Colonial Times. After lunch, return to D.C. to visit the United States Holocaust Museum to see the exhibit Daniel’s Story, followed by the Permanent Exhibition which provides a comprehensive historical narrative of the Holocaust. At historic and grand Union Station you will have time to visit the shops before enjoying an included dinner at the Thunder Grill before returning to our hotel. B, D

The Creation Museum and Ark Encounter

3 Days, #1 - April 26-28, 2018 (this departure is full) #2 - August 23-25, 2018

The Ark Encounter is the largest timber frame structure in the world, built from standing dead timber, in part by skilled Amish craftsman. The Ark is an architectural and engineering under containing three decks of world-class exhibits. Scores of exhibits about the flood, Noah, and the animals are designed to answer your questions about the biblical account of Noah's Ark. Many of the animals that lived during Noah's lifetime didn't look like animals we see today. See exotic animals from around the world in Ararat Ridge Zoo. Meet Noah and his seven other family members, who lived aboard the Ark and cared for all the animals during the flood. See what their living quarters may have looked like, what they could have brought on board, and even what kinds of clothing they wore. What happened to Noah, the animals, and the Earth after the flood? Find out the answers to these questions and more at Ark Encounter. Be sure to take time to visit the vast gift shop and eat a meal at Emazar's Kitchen, a 1,500 seat, two story restaurant. Work will continue on other projects surrounding the Ark, including a Walled City, the Tower of Babel, a first-century Middle Eastern village and several other similar projects.

the southwest. You will see the expanse of Canyonlands National Park stretching to the south and mighty Colorado River 2,000 feet below. Next arrive Capitol Reef National Park for a wonderful picnic lunch under towering cottonwood trees and sightseeing of ancient petroglyphs, beautiful rock formations, deep canyons and pioneer history. The park was established to protect a 100-mile wrinkle in the earth's crust called the Waterpocket Fold. You will learn about the geology and history of the canyon while taking in its breathtaking beauty.
